2012 Brundage Memorial Scholarship for LEC graduate students

The Dr. Robert Brundage Lake Erie Waterkeeper Inc. \$500 Scholarship will be awarded to a graduate student conducting thesis/dissertation research at the University of Toledo Lake Erie Center.

The primary focus of the applicants' research should be on Lake Erie, preferably western Lake Erie. A previous recipient may apply for a second award. No candidate may receive more than two awards.

Dr. Robert Brundage, or "Dr. Bob" as he was often called, was a native of Toledo, attended Scott High School, received a BS from The University of Toledo and a PhD from Brandeis University. Not only was he a research scientist but also an accomplished musician with his own recording company in Massachusetts. In 1997, he returned to Toledo and became active in many local organizations. He was an advocate for social justice, education and the environment. Among his many local activities he was on the Board of the Lake Erie Waterkeeper Inc. . He died in 2009 as a result of injuries sustained during a robbery.

Dr. Bob's thinking was global; his actions were local. His presence and efforts to make this a better world will be greatly missed. To continue his intention to foster solutions to the environmental issues in Western Lake Erie, the LEWI has created a scholarship in his honor for graduate students at the University of Toledo Lake Erie Center.

The Lake Erie Waterkeeper (LEWI) serves Lake Erie from the headwaters of the Maumee River in Fort Wayne, Indiana, east to the shores in New York and Pennsylvania. The mission of LEWIis, "To preserve, protect, and improve the waters and fish of Lake Erie, the warmest, shallowest, most biologically productive area in all of the Great Lakes through collaboration, education, and advocacy."

LEWI is a non-profit 501c3 and is a member of the international Waterkeeper Alliance linking WLEWA with water experts around the world.
